#### Advocacy

This year, DATTA Vic has continued to advocate on behalf of our members and learning area. After years of lobbying the Minister of Education and the Department of Education & Training to extend their *Secondary Science & Mathematics Initiative*, the State Government announced the establishment of a Graduate Certificate in Design & Technologies Education in their 2022 budget.

#### Advocacy

There will be 50 out-of-field educators trained in Design & Technologies education, and half of them will be from rural/regional schools.

DATTA Vic have been invited to work with four Universities on their responses to tender to the DET to deliver the Graduate Certificate in Design & Technologies Education:

- The University of Melbourne
- RMIT
- Deakin University
- ACU

This means that whoever is successful, DATTA Vic will be involved in the development and delivery of the course.

### Tackling the Teacher Shortage

The critical shortage of Design & Technologies teachers in Victorian Schools is one of the key drivers in DATTA Vic's operations.

One of our most successful initiatives for tackling the critical shortage of teachers in our learning area has been our **Teaching Design Masterclass program**.

Since we delivered our pilot in 2019, over **100** out-of-field educators have gone through this program.

Thanks to the financial support of Creative Futures, we have been able to deliver three Online Teaching Design Masterclasses for regional teachers for free.

The program has been extended to include a VCE Systems Engineering Masterclass and a Primary Masterclass.

### Tackling the Teacher Shortage

Creative Futures have also funded two other key initiatives to address the teacher shortage:

- DATTA Vic are running three Design Education Sprints with Industrial Design and Engineering Undergraduate students in order to encourage them to consider teaching as a career.
- DATTA Vic are engaged in an ongoing program with Museums Victoria to deliver an annual Teaching Design workshop targeting out of field educators.

This year, DATTA Vic has successfully applied for funding to run programs which support our members, including:

- The Google Educator Grant for our Real World Robotics Breaking Down Barriers to STEM Education initiative
- Creative Futures Funding for our Design Education Sprints and Online Teaching Design Masterclass
- Funding from the DET/Academy of Teaching & Leadership to develop and deliver Masterclasses for the *Teaching Excellence Program*
- Funding from the Department of Education and Training to deliver education resources and professional learning for their Station Ideation – A Minecraft Mission program








Membership by School Type




Membership by Location

### **Professional Learning**

Some highlights of our professional learning program:

#### **Teaching Design Masterclasses**

Our Teaching Design Masterclasses continue to support out-of-field educators with delivering the Design & Technologies curriculum in a safe, engaging manner. In 2021/2022, over 40 teachers participated in this virtual program. Thanks to funding from Creative Futures, 10 of these teachers – mostly from rural/regional schools, could take part for free.



#### **Creative Futures Annual Design Workshop**

In partnership with Museums Victoria and funded by Creative Futures, we delivered the second Creative Futures Annual Design Workshop. Again targeted at out-of-field educators, this program seeks to develop new ways to use museum collections and services to support the teaching of Design & Technologies.

### **Professional Learning**

Some highlights of our professional learning program:

#### Station Ideation – A Minecraft Mission

The Department of Education and Training engaged DATTA Vic to work with them on delivering their *Station Ideation-A Minecraft Mission* – a student challenge using Minecraft to design elements of the new Town Hall station. We produced education resources and professional learning.



#### **Teaching Excellence Program**

The Academy of Teaching and Leadership engaged DATTA Vic to develop and deliver Design & Technologies teacher masterclasses for their new teaching Excellence program. We were able to explore a range of concepts central to the future of design education — speculative design, student activism, teaching in a post-industrial world, etc.

### **Professional Learning**

Some highlights of our professional learning program:

#### **Online Teach Meets**

Last financial year, over 230 teachers attended our free online teach meets. What started as a way to keep connected during lockdown, this initiative has evolved to become one of our most popular programs. Some of the topics we've covered have been *Teaching First Nations Knowledge in Design & Technologies, Teaching the Capabilities, Future-Focussed STEM and Speculative Design*.





#### **STEM Upskilling Program**

Thanks to support from the Strategic Partnership Program Fund, we've been able to deliver a range of upskilling workshops at discounted costs to members. These have included A Beginners Guide to Tinkercad, Getting Started with Fusion 360 and a Beginners' Arduino Masterclass

#### **Future Plans**

- Designing the Future, our first in-person conference since 2019 is happening in December at Banyule Nillumbik Tech School
- We look forward to working with the University selected by the DET to deliver the Graduate Certificate in Design & Technologies Education









- We'll be lobbying these Universities to adapt the coursework for the Graduate Certificate in D&T education for Initial Teacher Education
- We are running *Design Education Sprints* with Industrial Design undergraduates to persuade them to consider a career in teaching
- We are about to pilot a Teaching Design and Creative Thinking Masterclass for primary teachers

#### **Future Plans**

- We'll be working in partnership with NGV on a teacher professional learning program on *Alexander McQueen Mind, Mythos, Muse* in 2023
- We'll be delivering services to support teachers with the implementation of the new VCE PD&T Study Design



- We're producing a new set of resources on Speculative Design for National Design & Technologies Week
- We'll be implementing phase 2 of our new website build, improving access to both our resources library and our shop
